CODE OF PRACTICE FOR MEMBERS / USERS

As a member of INGATESTONE & FRYERNING TENNIS CLUB you are expected to abide by the following code of practice:

ALL Members

1. All members must play within the rules and respect officials and their decisions.
2. All members must respect the rights, dignity and worth of all participants regardless of age, gender, ability, disability, race, cultural background, religion, beliefs or sexual orientation.
3. Members should keep to agreed timings for coaching and competitions, or inform their coach or team captain if they are going to be late.
4. Members must wear suitable tennis footwear and clothing when using the courts and must also carry their membership tags.
5. Members must pay any fees for membership, visitors, coaching or events promptly.
6. Members are not allowed to smoke on the premises.
7. Members should value and respect the clubhouse, courts and neighbouring properties.
8. Members should, wherever possible, keep tennis balls within the confines of the Club premises.
9. Members' conduct should be courteous, avoiding language which might cause offence to others.
10. Members must abide by the Club Constitution and rules and those of the Essex County Lawn Tennis Association (ECLTA) and the Lawn Tennis Association (LTA) and its Disciplinary Code.

Juniors

1. Juniors are not allowed inside the clubhouse unless adult members are present on the premises.
2. Juniors' guests are only allowed with the permission of, and at the discretion of a Committee member.

Parents

1. Encourage your child to learn the rules of tennis and play within them.
2. Set a good example by recognising fair play and applauding the good performances of all and not just results.
3. Never punish or belittle a child for losing or making mistakes.
4. Publicly accept judgements made by match officials and coaches and discourage unfair play.
5. Support your child's involvement and help them to enjoy their sport.
6. Be patient - steady progression is unusual in children; peaks and plateaus are common.
